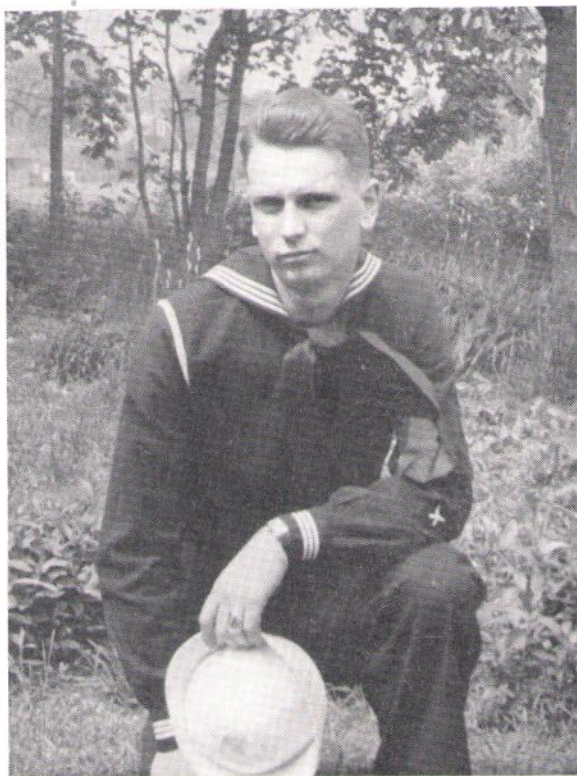

Posthumously awarded the Purple Heart.

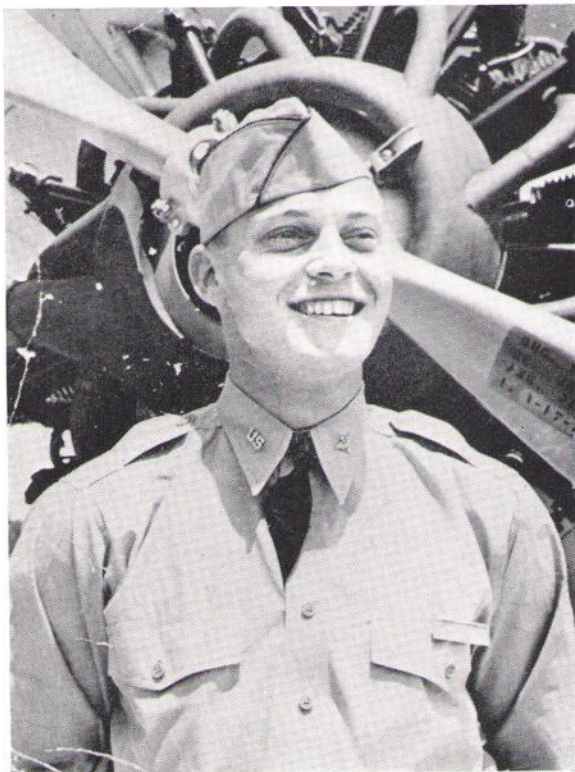
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Robert Marshall Freeman

as a unit of the U. S. Army Air Corps.

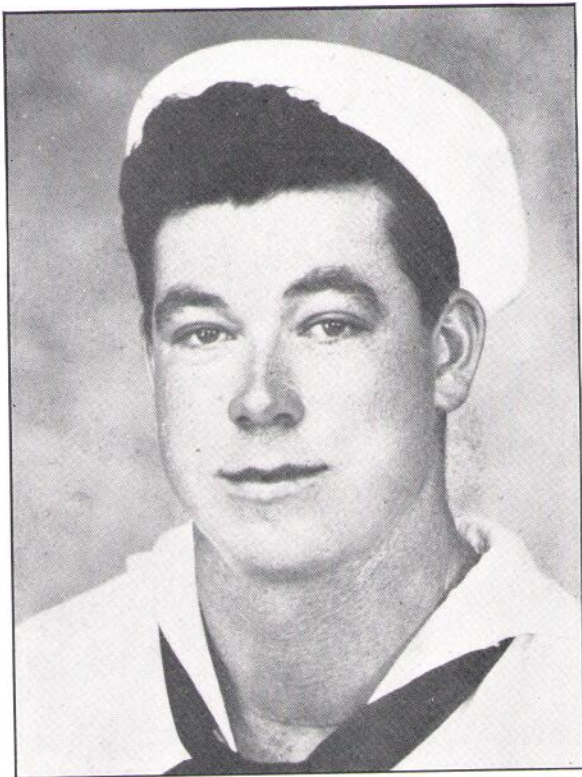
Killed in aerial combat over France, December 20, 1942.

Attended Hanover High School

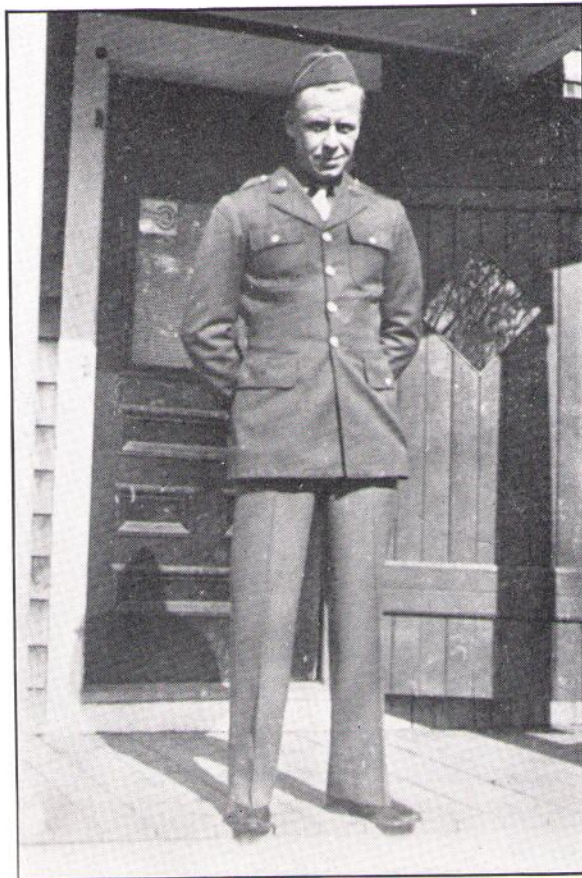
